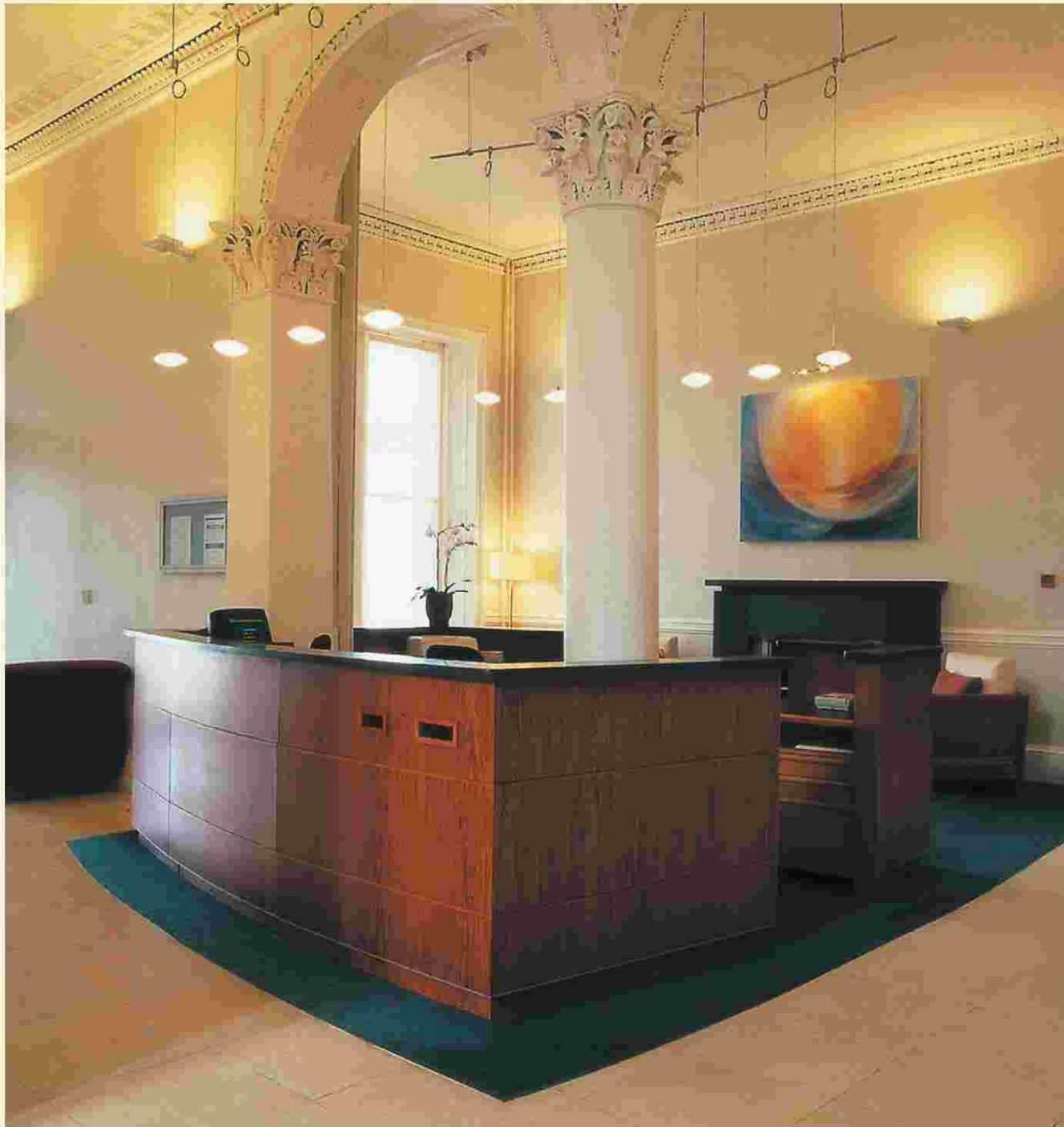

Many of the 59 en-suite bedrooms are designed along a nautical theme, in keeping with the hotel's seafront location. Guests can select a room to suit both their needs (family, double, twin, single) and their budget (superior, executive and standard). Many come with ocean views and the décor reflects the style of the room, from the old world Colonial charm of Captains rooms to the clean simplicity of standard rooms.

All rooms come equipped with TV, hair dryer and hospitality tray and are non-smoking. Room service is available 24 hours. There are some rooms that have access for the disabled (please enquire at time of booking).



## Enjoy your meal

Enjoy a drink or light meal in the hotel's Caledonian Café Bar where a modern spacious interior provides various separate areas in which to unwind over a drink or bite to eat. There are well-spaced tables for diners, fireside couches to relax on and spectacular views of the bay and islands. In the café bar the menu provides you with a wide range of traditional and contemporary dishes throughout the day.

Dinner is served in our Restaurant Caledonian in an intimate candlelit setting. Here the menu changes daily in keeping with the seasonal and local produce the chef selects and in order to offer guests plenty of variety. ## Meetings and Events

The hotel has three excellent spaces for business meetings and conferences. The largest is the Caledonian Suite, catering for up to 120 people, theatre style; this suite can also be arranged boardroom, U-shape or classroom style.

The Boardroom holds up to 12 people, depending on layout, whilst the Meeting Room accommodates up to 10. Flip charts, stationery, screens and white boards are provided free of charge. The gorgeous setting is perfect for weddings and the hotel has a civil license for both the Caledonian Suite and Boardroom. ## Exploring the Area

Often referred to as 'The Gateway to Argyll and The Isles', Oban is the ideal base for Island hopping and Island tours. Scenic views, deserted beaches and fascinating wildlife are to be found in abundance. There are numerous walking and running trails, and, of course, regular fishing excursions. Other outdoor activities include diving, bird watching and even, if you're lucky, whale-spotting.

Famous local landmarks include McCaigs Tower, the Falls of Lora and Dunstaffnage Castle. Steeped in history, this was a MacDougal stronghold until seized by Robert The Bruce in 1309 but today all visitors are welcome.

Family attractions include the Rare Breeds Park and the Sea Life Centre; a visit to Cruachan Power Station takes you inside a hollow mountain and at the Oban Distillery you can watch distillers at work and enjoy a complimentary wee dram. All this and so much more awaits you.
